

2023 Lenten Bible Challenge

Lent is a season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. In Christian tradition, people abstain from entertainment, sensual pleasures and worldly desires during Lent. Many Christians use this time to prepare their body, mind, and spirit to be baptized on Easter.

We want to spend this Lenten journey with **Paul's Letter to Romans** (16 chapters) and **Gospel according to Luke** (24 chapters). We will have 40 chapters to read each day of Lent. You will also be given 3 questions each day to meditate on the given chapter. You are invited to write your thoughts on the given paper.

Here are guidelines:

1. Each Sunday a weekly schedule (a chapter and three questions for the day) will be available with Sunday Bulletin (*This will be also available through News 3700)
2. Each day, read the chapter of the day, and write your answers to three questions on the weekly schedule (this will be your weekly journal). There is no right or wrong answer. You can also write any questions on the journal instead of answers.
3. You have three choices regarding what to do with your journal as below:
 - a. You may keep your journey to yourself.
 - b. You may bring your weekly journal to church and discuss it in small groups after church three times (March 5, 19, and April 2). Please sign up to be in a small group. Each small group will have 3-4 people and we will divide the groups according to the number of people who sign up for small group discussion.
 - c. You may join a **zoom meeting** on the following days to share your thoughts and journey with others. If you want to join in this zoom meeting, let pastor Lee know (slee@cumcstockton.org) by Ash Wednesday (02.22.2023)
 - i. March 5 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
 - ii. March 19 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
 - iii. April 2 (Sunday) 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm
4. You may do this together with your loved ones at home. This can be your Lenten **Family** Journey!

1. Judas Iscariot planned to betray Jesus. Disciples planned to have a Passover meal with Jesus. What are you planning to do with Jesus now?
2. What are the meaning of bread and wine according to Jesus' own words? How do you perceive them when you take communion at church?
3. In your opinion, who was the worst among these: chief priests and scribes, Peter who denied Jesus three times, people who mocked and beat Jesus, disciples who slept while Jesus was praying and you. Why do you think so?

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Day 39 April 7 (Fri)

Luke 23

1. Why did Pilate send Jesus to Herod, and why did Herod send Jesus back to Pilate?
2. When did you give in to the public pressure or peer pressure and did something against your own conviction or conscience?
3. With whom do you identify yourself at the last moment of Jesus' life on the Cross? (Simon of Cyrene who took the Cross for Jesus, women who were beating their breasts and wailing for Jesus, people who stood by watching, leaders who scoffed at Jesus, one of the criminals on the cross who mocked Jesus, one of the criminals on the cross who pleaded to Jesus to save him, and Joseph from Arimathea)
