SERMON IN A NUTSHELL: "BLESSED ARE YOU!"

When do you feel that you are blessed?

I feel that I am blessed right now. Who am I to preach a sermon to these wonderful people? What a privilege and what an awesome opportunity. I am still alive after a serious car accident and surgery! I am blessed that I am breathing.

Jesus called this kind of mind-set as poor in spirit. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." When we feel that we do not deserve God's grace, but God still loves us and gives us favor, we are poor in spirit. Like the prodigal son in Luke 15, we will seek God's forgiveness and grace, and we can *enjoy relationship with God* (In other words, *we have the Kingdom of God*!).

The opposite state of being poor in spirit would be arrogant spirit. With arrogant spirit, people would say, "I should have a better job or higher position!" or "I should marry a richer, younger, and better spouse" or "I should be recognized more!" They are not blessed. They are filled with complaints. They are unhappy! They eventually accuse God. "Lord, you are not fair, and you do not do your job! I can do better without you!" They do not enjoy their relationship with God. They do not have the Kingdom of God!

Psalm 1:1 says, "Blessed are those who do not follow the advice of the wicked!" The advice of the wicked says, "You will not die when you take the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of the good and evil." In other words, when we doubt God's promises and commands and insist that our own thought is better than God's words, we are following the advice of the wicked. Blessed ones do not take such advice.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."

When we are poor in spirit, we repent our sins, self-centered lifestyle. Like the prodigal son in Luke 15, we cry out in front of God, confessing our sins! "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your child!" But God would comfort us and have a feast with us!

"Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth."

Because now we know that we have everything through God's grace, we do not boast our own talents or wisdom for our achievements in the world. We are forgiven sinners and we are willing and ready to forgive others who sin against us or who fail in the world! That is the reason why we become meek. Like the one whose huge debts are cancelled and becomes generous, we become meek. We easily forgive the mistakes and failures of others. If we become like this at home, our spouses and children would be very relaxed. Our colleagues at work would feel more comfortable working with us. Then people feel comfortable around us and want to do business with us. That is how we inherit the earth.

The opposite character of being meek would be scoffing. Psalm 1:1 talks about the ones who follow the advice of the wicked, saying, "They take the path that sinners tread or sit in the seat of scoffers." They laugh at others and put them at the top of the universe. A good example would be a White Supremacist. A White Supremacist would think that other races are not good enough to be anything. They laugh at other races.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."

We do not boast our achievements and we do not scoff others when they do not achieve things in the world. We work hard faithfully, but we know that we are able to do all the works because God provides and protects us.

When I had an accident, I realized that there was nothing that I could do. I simply slept during surgery. Doctors did all the lifesaving jobs and I slept through. After the surgery, I was tied up both arms and legs. I

could not even go to the bathroom alone. Nurses did all the work, and I was passively receiving all the services. Whenever I needed something, even a cup of water, I rang the bell and patiently waited for their services. I thought about my spiritual life there. God is doing everything, and I am just receiving God's grace. There is nothing that I can claim as my own! I hunger and thirst for God's righteousness, the faithfulness of Jesus. Then my thirst and hunger were filled. I am saved.

"Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy."

Through this experience in the ICU, I became more merciful. I understood that nurses had to take care of many patients at night. Some are in excruciating pain and could not help but crying and screaming. Even when I needed something, I could not say that I should be a priority. I understood the situation and prayed for others.

So, I always said thank you to the nurses. I tried to complement their services. I receive mercy and they did their best in their services. I learned that when I am merciful, others are merciful to me.

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God."

Now after we see our realities as forgiven sinners, our heart becomes pure, and we can see God. When we think that we are somebody, we cannot see God because all we can see is us. Everything is about me!

When our hearts become pure, we know that everything is not about me. There are other human beings here on earth! Everybody is different and uniquely abled. God created everything with unique qualities. We all need each other. When we see God, we see others as God's masterpiece. Do not touch the artwork done by God! Do not speak ill of the masterpiece of God! You never know who is listening!

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

When we become humble and respect others, we can make peace. When we become violent, we try to control everything according to our own will. Some people even kill others with weapons to show that he or she is in control. However, the end is always tragic because those criminals end up destroying themselves also. Last week a 72-year-old gunman killed himself after he shot and killed 10 others in Monterey Park, CA. That was a tragedy that we read in a newspaper now every day. Ah, Lord, forgive us!

When we say that we may be wrong and others maybe right, we do not use forces to make our plan go through. We can discuss options and other plans. Because we do not know which one is better, we try one plan with an open mind. If it does not work, we are willing to try other plans. That is how we work together as children of God. No wars and no guns are necessary. We can talk and negotiate.

However, not everybody is blessed.

That means that not everybody is poor in spirit, ready to repent, meek, merciful, respectful, and peaceful. Some people will be arrogant, scornful, self-righteous, relentless, and violent. We will face persecution and violence in this world.

What would be a biblical response to those people? Non-violent resistance is the answer.

Jesus said, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you." Sometimes the only reward we expect comes after death. In this world, we suffer helplessly. We resist without using violence and get killed. It is not fair! However, that is what Jesus is talking about now. Why do you want us to follow this non-violence, Jesus?

Why do we take non-violent resistance position?

It is difficult for us to be persecuted by evil ones. It is not fair! We want revenge. However, revenge gets another revenge. Later there will be no good ones and bad ones. Everybody will be in fights. We see that in long-term conflicts between tribes and nations. In the beginning, there must be someone who was at fault. After many rounds of revenges, we do not know anymore who is better. If one side gets persecution without retaliation for many years, we know who is bad and who needs to be saved. That is why the Bible asks us to be persecuted without revenge.

If you think that is not fair, think about the justice system that we have. We do not allow private retaliation. When someone kills our family members, we do not go after them and take revenge. We report the murder to the police and trust our justice system even when it is not perfect. Sometimes criminals walk free. Sometimes innocent people spend their lives in prison. Some feel that it is a broken system. However, what is the alternative? Reformation is necessary but, if we allow private retaliation, we will live in chaos like the wild, wild, west. We live with an imperfect but second-best justice system because that keeps our society in order. We trust judges. We trust our fellow citizens, juries, even though we know that they are not perfect.

We can say the same thing with cosmic court. We trust God and God's justice system. We do not take private retaliation and revenge. When we are persecuted, we take non-violent resistance, trusting that God would bring justice eventually. Unlike our juries and human judges, God is a perfect judge. We can trust God's judgment. Maybe not in my lifetime, but in God's time. Some people do not trust God and try to fix injustice in the world with their own ways and create more mess!

Prophet Micah says, "He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?"

Jesus has done that. Jesus focused on doing justice, practicing loving kindness, and walking humbly with God! Without sins, Jesus was persecuted and killed on the Cross. However, God resurrected Jesus after three days and put him on the right side of the heavenly throne to be the King of the kings. He was the first but not the last. All those who die with injustice will be resurrected also and rule over the wicked at the end. It would be God's cosmic justice where all the wicked will be punished in hell. That is why we need hell at the end to guarantee cosmic justice. That is why we can today endure injustice and persecution while doing justice and practicing loving kindness. We walk humbly with God! May God bless you all who follow this non-violent resistance in justice work! Amen.
